OPEN BURNING INFORMATION

For residents of Miami Township & Yellow Springs*

What is open burning?

The Ohio EPA defines open burning as any time you light an outdoor fire without a chimney or stack.

Why is open burning a problem?

Open burning can release many kinds of toxic fumes as well as millions of spores. These substances can cause many people with allergies or asthma to have difficulty breathing. Additionally, open burning makes it difficult to meet health-based air quality standards.

What open burning is never allowed?

Under Ohio law, these materials may not be burned at any time:

- Garbage: any wastes created in the process of handling, preparing, cooking or consuming food.
- Materials containing rubber, grease and asphalt or made from petroleum products, such as tires, cars and auto parts, plastics or plastic-coated wire.
- Dead animals or other bio-hazardous waste.

Other restrictions include:

- Open burning is not allowed when air pollution warnings, alerts or emergencies are in effect. If in doubt, contact Regional Air Pollution Control at (800) 458-2115.
- Fires and smoke cannot obscure visibility on roads.
- No wastes generated off the premises may be burned. For example, a tree trimming contractor may not haul branches or limbs to another site to burn.
- Open burning is generally not allowed within 1000' of Village limits and/or 50' of a structure.

What happens if I'm caught illegally open burning?

You may be referred to the Ohio EPA, which has the authority to enforce the state's open burning laws. Violations can result in substantial penalties.
